

### From the Desk of Father Raaser

The Sunday after Christmas is always the beautiful Feast of the Holy Family. Devotion to the Holy Family grew in popularity during the 17th century. The Holy Family in art also became popular during this time. Many Popes promoted the feast

as a way to counter the breakdown of family life especially during the Industrial Revolution. Then on October 26, 1921, Pope Benedict XV inserted the Feast of the Holy Family into the General Calendar.

When a man marries a woman a family is established. One of the main purposes of marriage is to have children and raise them in an indissoluble, committed and faithful relationship between the mother and father, so as to increase the number of the Church and the world.

This past December 8<sup>th</sup>, Pope Francis wrote an Apostolic Letter about St. Joseph: "Patris Corde," (With a Father's Heart"). The letter begins: "WITH A FATHER'S HEART: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as 'the son of Joseph.' The Pope called for a **Year of Saint Joseph** to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a Decree granting plenary indulgences for this special year for special devotions particularly on Wednesday.

Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. He is to be the example of Christian fatherhood for our families.

The Holy Father wrote Saint Joseph is, the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence, who nonetheless played an incomparable role in the history of salvation. In him, we never see frustration, but only trust...His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust. St. Joseph is the model of fatherhood, because our world "needs fathers," and not "tyrants"; a society that "rejects those who confuse authority with authoritarianism, service with servility, discussion with oppression, charity with a welfare mentality, power with destruction." (Pope Francis)

True fathers, "refuse to live the lives of their children for them," and instead respect their freedom. In this sense, says Pope Francis, a father realizes that "he is most a father and an educator at the point when he becomes 'useless,' when he sees that his child has become independent and can walk the paths of life unaccompanied." The goal of parents is to make independent, well-adjusted, self-sufficient and most important, holy adults.

At the conclusion of his Letter, the Pope adds another prayer to St Joseph, which he encourages all of us to pray together:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

It is a beautiful meditation on fatherhood, a bit wordy, but that is the style of Pope Francis. Our prayer is that the Holy Family: Jesus Mary and St. Joseph watch over and protect your family.

### **MASS CARDS:**

The giving of a "Mass Card" to an individual or a family is a traditional and honored custom of the Catholic Community.

Mass Cards can be given or sent for:-the repose of the soul of a deceased person or for a Special Intention: -Special Intention Cards are for a living person and are obtained for a number of reasons: general good wishes, birthdays, anniversaries, return to good health, in thanksgiving, or for a particular need or moment in the life of another, e.g. a new home.

### There are two types of Mass Cards:

- -An "Announced Mass" means that the Mass will be celebrated on a certain day at a scheduled Mass time when the priest announces the intention to the congregation and it is printed in the weekly parish bulletin.
- -An "<u>Unannounced Mass</u>" refers to a Mass when the intention is remembered by one of the priests at a Mass that has no announced intention. Mass cards may be obtained at the Parish Center during regular office hours (9 AM 4:30 PM, Mon. Fri.).

The donation for an Announced Mass is \$ 15; \$10 for an Unannounced Mass.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peerson

To be cute about it, I quote here an American humorist by the name of Evan Esar (d. 1995): "Family: A social unit where the father is concerned with parking space, the children with outer space, and the mother with closet space. "Whether Mr. Esar was fully correct or not, there is a grain of truth in what he wrote, and there is always some truth in wholesome humor


However, for my purpose I prefer this statement of Sir Winston Churchill about the nature of family. "There is no doubt that it is around family and the home that all the greatest virtues ...are created, strengthened, and maintained."

Over this holiday we are most likely to be with family, either literally or virtually because of the virus. We can verify Sir Winston's observation. Family also gives us the answers to most of life's important questions. Do you think the young Jesus had questions? Certainly He must have, because remember He took on a human nature "like ours in everything but sin." What is one of the principal ways we learn? Through answers to questions. Through that triple-spoke process of lessons taught, example given, and experience lived, Our Lord and Savior indeed grew in wisdom and grace.

I think it is an important detail that all this happened in the little village of Nazareth, on the edge of the empire, far from the high society and corruption of Rome and it is nowhere even mentioned in the whole Old Testament. Great things can happen in humble places, as our family homes most often attest. Could Our Lord have had better teachers in how to handle life than Mary and Joseph? Hardly. Without any advanced degrees, we can say with conviction that both Christ's parents had "PhD's" in holiness. Mary who was declared "full of grace" by an archangel, and Joseph remembered as a "just man" cannot be excelled at their task. The Holy Spirit has decided not to tell us if any peers taught Jesus things, but we can imagine they too played a part, in His human upbringing. So we stand back for a time from all our concerns to admire and celebrate this Holy Family. We can see the necessity of these thirty or so years to prepare Our Lord for His incomparable mission.

That brings up the subject of our mission. It begins in our family circle, but it has to expand from there if we are to take our Baptismal and **Confirmation promises seriously. That means** doing our part to tell the waiting world all about Iesus and His Good News, even if the world neither acknowledges nor cares that it is waiting. Waiting for something, or more accurately, Someone, beyond its own calculations to give it purpose. Taking up the admonitions of Sirach and Colossians, which we read this weekend, is a good place to begin. After all, that's our way to heaven. Here is George Bernard Shaw's take on family: "A happy family is but an earlier heaven." Think about that! God love you and give you His peace in 2021!
